

## Highland Classic 2026 Instructions to Riders

Here are some instructions for you to follow when attending the 2026 Highland Classic to assist everyone in having an enjoyable event.

### **Start Permission:**

Overseas riders must obtain a start permission and insurance cover from their organising authority. Please e-mail these before the event to:

### **Signing On:**

Arrive Early! Signing on begins at 08:30 on the Saturday, note your riding number, have your **competition licence** to hand as it will most likely be scanned this year at signing on.

Signing on within the large Biomass shed: What3Words: **///complies.trails.tilts**

When you have shown your licence, be that SACU/ACU or otherwise, you will then be given your welcome pack which includes your machine riding number and a small riding number decal to fix to the rear of your helmet to make identification easier.

### **Signing Off:**

All riders **MUST** sign off at Trial HQ both days when finished or if you retire.

Please refrain from parking your vehicle in the Zip Wire private car park as it is needed for their staff and customers all day. If you do park there, you will be requested to vacate the area immediately.

If you are travelling to the trial from the south, then the best route is to leave the A9 at Kingussie North exit and then turn right at the 'T' junction for the **A9152** to 'Kincraig'. About 1.5 kms after Kincraig, the entrance to Alvie Estate is on the left and will have a large yellow sign 'IDMCC Trial'. Follow the orange flags to where ample car parking will be available. Please note: **THERE IS NO OVERNIGHT CAMPING/BARBEQUES ALLOWED ON ALVIE ESTATE.**

There is a speed limit of 15 MPH on the estate roads!

The course is all on private land, each lap approximately four miles in length. No fuel available at start. There is a BP Petrol Station at 62 Grampian Rd, Aviemore PH22 1PD. There is no requirement for machines to be registered for the public highway. No part of this event takes place on the public highway.

**Dalraddy Holiday Park residents:**

For those staying at Dalraddy Camping and Caravan Park (1.5 miles), there is a path which you would be able to ride your machine to Alvie Estate, as long as you have someone transporting your tools, fuel etc by the roadway to Alvie, so that you have a base to work from near the start. You will need to dismount and push your machine across the A9152 at one point only.

**Rubbish:**

Your Welcome Pack includes a black bin bag, please use this to store any rubbish accumulated during the weekend and dispose of it at home please. Help us keep Alvie Estate litter free this weekend.
